
There is no doubt that WA will play a vital role in the supply chain over the next decade.

## Keynote Presenters



### Hon. Norman Moore

Minister for Mines and Petroleum, Western Australia

Hon. Norman Moore was appointed Minister for Mines and Petroleum; Fisheries; Electoral Affairs on the election of the Liberal-National Government in September 2008.

His priorities for his portfolio are: improving and accelerating the State Government approvals processes for resources exploration and development to increase certainty for industry, attract investment and increase economic benefits for Western Australia.



### Dr Gene Clark

Chief Executive Officer, TradeTech USA

Dr R. Gene Clark has experiences in both the trading and analysis of nuclear fuel markets. For the past 14 years, he has been principal and CEO of TradeTech, a US firm providing market information and consulting services to the nuclear fuel industry



### Hon. Paul Holloway MLC

Minister for Mineral Resources Development, South Australia

Paul entered Parliament in 1995 and was elected Deputy Opposition Leader in the Upper House in 1997. He was elected Leader of the Government in the Legislative Council and appointed Minister for Agriculture, Food and Fisheries and Minister for Mineral Resources Development in March 2002. He currently remains the Government Upper House Leader, Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning and Minister for Small Business.



### Dean Dalla Valle

Chief Operating Officer, Uranium Australia, BHP Billiton

Dean is the Chief Operating Officer for BHP Billiton's newly created Uranium Australia, responsible for the Olympic Dam copper / uranium mine in SA and the multi-billion dollar proposal to expand the mine from Australia's largest underground operation to one of the world's biggest open pit mines. Dean has oversight of all uranium projects in Australia, and is focused on breakthrough improvements in uranium recoveries.



### Hon. Kon Vatskalis

Minister for Primary Industry, Fisheries and Resources, NT Government

In 2001, Kon was elected to the NT Legislative Assembly. Kon has held numerous ministerial portfolios. His current portfolio responsibilities account for a significant majority of the Northern Territory budget and contribute important opportunities for regional economic development and indigenous enterprise.



### Dr Ziggy Switkowski

Chair, Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation

Dr Switkowski is the Chair of the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation. He is also a non-executive director of Suncorp, Tabcorp and Healthscope, and Chair of Opera Australia. In 2006 he chaired the Prime Minister's Review of Uranium Mining, Processing and Nuclear Energy which returned nuclear power to the country's strategic debate.



### Mr Koji Yamashita

Deputy Director for Nuclear Facility Development and Nuclear Fuel Cycle Industry Division, Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) Japan

Mr Yamashita joined the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry in 2004. He has been engaged in policy making for Official Development Aid and Technical Standards. His current role as the Deputy Director for the Agency of Natural Resources and Energy involves international liaison in nuclear fuel cycle industry.



### Michael J Connor
